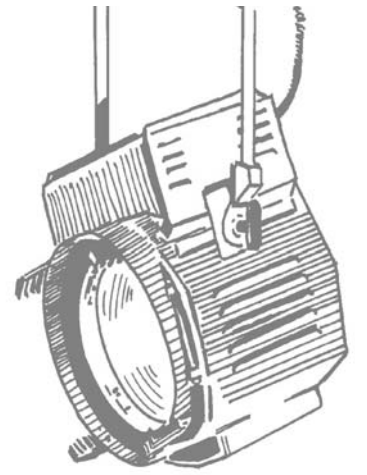


Knightstown's Got Talent!

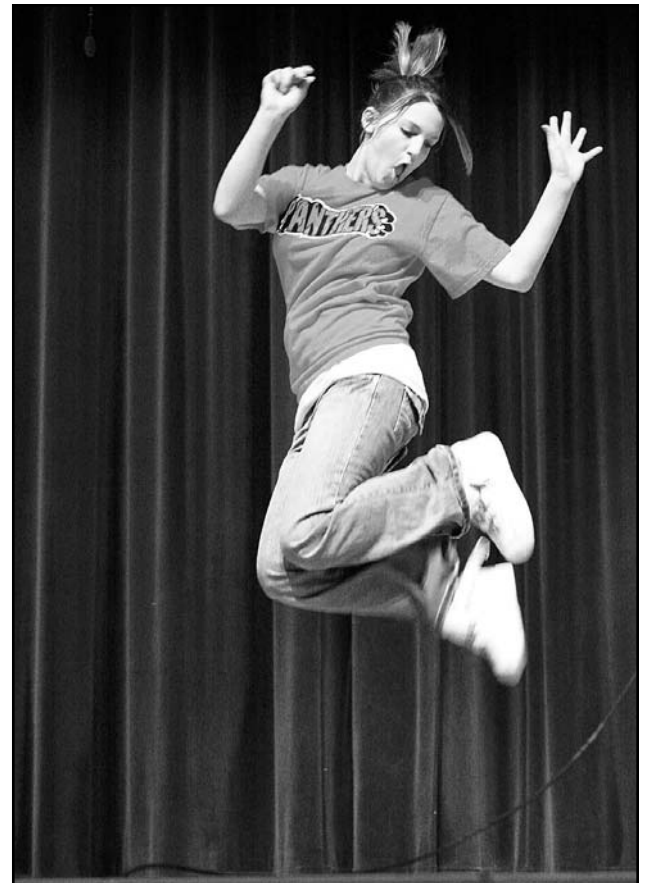
Sophomore Kyle Wardlow performs a gospel song in his deep baritone voice. Wardlow took home a third place prize.
